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INT. OFFICE - DAY

Mr. Folsey stares at the back of Rojelio, as he closes the door. Rojelio glances up at Mr. Folssy, as he comes around the desk, and sits down.

Rojelio stares down at his hands, then up at Mr. Folsey, who studies him.

MR. FOLSEY

Tu hablas ingles?

ROJELIO

Yes.

MR. FOLSEY

Good. English only... because I don't speak Spanish. So when you're here, let's make this easy for both of us. Got it...?

Rojelio nods.

MR. FOLSEY (CONT'D)

Your name.

ROJELIO

Rojelio -

MR. FOLSEY

English.

ROJELIO

Roger...

Mr. Folsey continues to study

MR. FOLSEY

Very good. You like red meat,
Roger...?

ROJELIO

Yes...

MR. FOLSEY

It's a litmus test. You know what that is...?

Roger nods.

MR. FOLSEY (CONT'D)

Good. I like red meat. You like red meat then we got something in common, right?

ROJELIO

Right.

MR. FOLSEY

Because if you don't like red meat I think we've got a problem... I think I don't take a chance on you. Not liking red meat says a lot about you, in my opinion, about your character. It says, you're here but you don't like it here. Loving red meat - a staple on most dinner tables - says you love what's here... We got that in common... Same is true if I don't hire you. It Would be a safe assumption that you wouldn't like me very much... if you don't walk out of here with a job, right...?

(smiles casually, pauses)
Common interests make it easier for
me to like someone I could
potentially hire... Why would I
hire someone I don't like? Why
would you work for someone you
don't like...? Probably out of
necessity but you shouldn't do it
either way... so I don't...

(beat)

I like my meat rare. Doesn't matter what it is, steak, burger, pot roast. Red... (with) a side of mashed potatoes, swimming in gravy... How bout you...?
